Amy Roth Associate

Amy joined the [National Stewardship Action Council](http://nsaction.us) (NSAC) as a part-time employee in August 2021 and currently serves as the organization's Associate. NSAC is a 501(c)(4) nonprofit organization that will advocate for a Circular Economy anywhere in the U.S.

Amy has worked in the recycling and materials management industry for over 20 years, with her career starting in state government at the Massachusetts Department of Environmental Protection. Before consulting, Amy worked at the Oregon Department of Environmental Quality developing the Oregon E-Cycles program.



Amy has consulted with nonprofits and organizations for over a decade, advising on fundraising and program development, as well as operational, fiscal, communication, membership management and grant writing. Some of her clients have included the American Chemistry Council, Association of Oregon Recyclers, City of Portland, Denton Plastics, Global Electronics Council, Oregon Green Schools, Responsible Purchasing Network, and The Recycling Partnership.

From 2018 – 2020, Amy represented the Association of Oregon Recyclers on the Oregon Department of Environmental Quality's sixteen-member Recycling Steering Committee who collaborated to identify and implement changes needed in Oregon's recycling system. The committee reached consensus on a comprehensive framework to modernize Oregon's recycling system, which led to the development and passage of the Plastic Pollution and Recycling Modernization Act in 2021. This historical legislation will completely overhaul Oregon's recycling system, building on local community programs leveraging the resources of producers to create a "shared responsibility" system.

Amy also served as the Chair of the National Recycling Coalition's Recycling Organizations Council from 2018 to 2020.

Amy received her Bachelor's Degree in Environmental Analysis and Policy and a Master's in Urban Planning both from Boston University.
